

## **IQAC Report 2005-06**

### **INTRODUCTION :**

This college was accredited by NAAC on 16-2-2004. As per the guidelines received from the Director, NAAC, under his letter number NAAC / VS / Dir.Sec / IQAC-211 / 2004 dated 20-2-2004, the Quality Advisory Committee (QAC) and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) were established for the year 2004-05. As per the revised guidelines received from Prof. K. Banadarangaiah, Academic Consultant, NAAC under his letter No. NAAC / KBR / IQAC-AQAR / 2005 dated 28-6-2005, Internal Quality Assurance Cell was established in this accredited institution for the academic year 2005-06.

## **PART A**

The IQAC met in the chamber of the Principal on 2-7-2005 and chalked out the plan of action for the enhancement of quality of higher education in the college for the academic year 2005-06.

### **The plan of action :**

1. Decided to organise two-day national level seminar on 'Creative Teaching in Higher Education : An Inevitable Necessity'.
2. Decided to apply and request the authorities of Karnatak University for grant of permission to host 55<sup>th</sup> Karnatak University Inter Collegiate Athletic Meet – 2005.
3. Decided to promote research activities by allowing teachers to join M.Phil. / Ph.D. courses. Teachers to be encouraged for carrying out minor research projects.
4. Decided to apply to UGC for starting of Add-on-Courses along with under graduate courses.
5. Decided to start BBA course, in case, if the University was permitted to do so.
6. For promoting teaching-learning process of English language, English language laboratory be established.
7. Steps to be initiated for purchase of books, equipments etc.
8. Teachers to be permitted to attend state, national level seminars, conferences and workshops to be held elsewhere.
9. Students should be encouraged and provided with full facilities for participation of sports meet, tournaments etc.
10. Efforts should be continued to complete construction of building projects like swimming pool, classrooms etc.
11. Students should be encouraged to take part in extra curricular activities like NCC, NSS, debate, elocution, cultural activities etc.
12. Publication of college miscellany to be continued.
13. Classroom teaching should be given priority, so that, completion of syllabi, conducting of tests, tutorials, seminars etc. can go uninterrupted and prepare students for their examination.
14. Teachers and students should be encouraged to take part in all such activities, which help keep them updated.

## **Achievement :**

A meeting of the members of IQAC was convened in the chamber of the Principal on 30-6-2006 to discuss the achievement of the plan of action for the year 2005-06. The committee expressed its happiness over the execution and achievement of the plan of action. The college has undertaken activities quite successfully during the academic year 2005-06.

## **PART B**

1. The college has continued its effort to provide quality education to the students, majority of them being from rural area.
2. BBA course has been started from the academic year 2005-06 after obtaining permission from the Government of Karnataka and affiliation from the Karnatak University.
3. Karnatak University has introduced semester system at the UG level from the academic year 2005-06. New system was being introduced, new syllabi was also framed. Most of the staff members have participated in the workshops on curriculum design conducted by the Karnatak University and by the fora of various subjects. The contribution of the staff members towards the design of curriculum was significant. Prof. B. K. Biradar has edited the book entitled "Kathasampad-1" which is to be introduced as textbook for Basic Kannada at B.A. part-I of Karnatak University during the academic year 2006-07. Some of the staff members have been serving as members of Board of Studies, Karnatak University, Dharwad.
4. The college has conducted examination during the year 2005-06 and has maintained discipline, secrecy and sanctity of the examination, so that, not even single small practice case was detected by the external squad, sitting squad etc.
5. Two staff members have been awarded Ph.D. degree in their subjects, one is about to submit his Ph.D. thesis for award of degree, and one has registered for Ph.D. degree, three for M.Phil. degree under FIP of UGC during this academic year.

6. The college has conducted two-day national seminar on 'Creative Teaching in Higher Education: An Inevitable Necessity' during July 15-16, 2005. It was a grand success.
7. Five staff members have received financial support from UGC for carrying-out minor research projects. All the projects are under progress.
8. The college has started poor students aid fund, towards which teaching staff members have contributed Rs. 1000/- each. A huge amount generated was paid to needy poor but brilliant students to meet their partial educational expenses.
9. NCC / NSS units of the college have rendered remarkable social service. A 10-day NSS camp was organised in the adopt village Madhurakhandi near Jamkhandi during Oct. 21-30, 2005. One NSS volunteer by name M. Y. Mantur has donated blood to one of the Bank employee, who was really in need of blood.
10. Guest faculties were recruited on consolidated salary. Teaching and Non-Teaching staff is approximately 2:1.
11. Library was kept open night upto 9 pm. during the examination days. New books worth approximately Rs. 2 lakh were purchased and subscription of journals were renewed.
12. Confidential feedbacks from the students about the teachers were taken and the comments made by the students were brought to the notices of the concerned teachers personally.
13. Unit cost of education during this academic year turns to be about Rs. 5,000/-.
14. Construction of swimming pool was completed at the total estimated cost of Rs. 46.42 lakh, out of which 50 percent share is yet to be released by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India.
15. Constructions of 4 classrooms were undertaken under the UGC assistance during X Plan. Out of 4 classrooms, 2 are complete in all respect and are put into use. Constructions of another 2 classrooms are in full progress and are likely to be ready before September 2006. Estimated cost was Rs. 16 lakh approximately.

16. Construction of Women's hostel under UGC assistance is going on. It has been planned to finish the construction work as early as possible, so that accommodation can be provided to girls during the academic year 2006-07. The estimated cost is Rs. 22 lakh approximately.
17. English language laboratory has been setup at the estimated cost of Rs. 2 lakh. This is the innovative new thing that has been added to make teaching English language more simple and easy.
18. Computer Internet facility is available in the college and teachers and students used to access it.
19. The college was able to provide financial support to large number of students in the form of scholarships, cash prizes, out of the interest earned on huge amount kept in the form of fixed deposit in banks. The scholarship available through Government department like National Scholarship, C. V. Raman Scholarship etc. were made availed by the students.
20. Alumni Association of the college has instituted cash prizes to those students, who exhibit outstanding performance in academic and in sports. The college has borne the fees of all the sports persons.
21. The performance of the students in examination April 2005 was excellent. The average pass percentage of the students in B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com. examination was above 80%. One of the students by name Mr. Sangappa Badagi has secured 6<sup>th</sup> rank at University level in B.A. examination April 2005.
22. The college has hosted 55<sup>th</sup> Karnatak University Inter-Collegiate Athletic Meet during December 3-6, 2005. The college was able to assemble 470 men and 104 women athletes from about 140 colleges and nearly 100 officials from various institutions. The meet was grand success.

The Athletic team of the college secured fourth place in the meet. Cycling team has secured championship in the Karnatak University Inter-Collegiate Cycling Tournament. Swimming team has secured runners-up place in the Inter-Collegiate Swimming Competitions.

All together ten sports persons of the college have been selected in the University team and played for University in Inter-University Meets. Two NCC cadets have attended R.D. parade at New Delhi on January 26, 2006.

23. Remedial courses were conducted for the benefit of slow learners. Global skill enhancement training was given to about 50 students for two and half months and prepared them for facing campus interview to be conducted by Infosys, and other B.P.O's.
24. Teachers were permitted to attend state / national level seminars and most of them have attended one or the other.

In all the academic year 2005-06 has brought name, fame and dividend for the college.

#### **Future plans :**

1. Establishment of Commerce laboratory.
2. Launching of college website.
3. Construction of four more classrooms on the first floor of the existing main building.
4. Introduction of Add-on courses.
5. Internet facility to be extended to college library.
6. Introduction of PG course in Electronics from the academic year 2007-08.
